

**NJ TRANSIT
NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING
FOR THE PROPOSED DEMOLITION OF THE
LACKAWANNA RECORDS BUILDING**

New Jersey Transit Corporation (NJ TRANSIT) proposes to demolish the vacant Lackawanna Records Building, located on the south side of Observer Highway between Washington and Hudson streets. The building is a contributing feature to the National Register of Historic Places eligible Old Main Delaware Lackawanna and Western Railroad Historic District. NJ TRANSIT is proposing the action due to structural deterioration and resulting concerns over public safety. The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs has issued a notice to demolish the structure no later than June 30, 2020.

The Multi-Service Center is a fully accessible facility. The Center is located along the City of Hoboken's free HOP bus service, and is within walking distance of the Hoboken Terminal and bus station.
